SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

College students will soon be returning to college for the second semester. High school seniors are gearing up for graduation. Time to start thinking about paying for college and a \$1,500 IHC Scholarship would help put a bite in the costs.

The Scholarship Committee will be meeting late in January to update the application for the three scholarships administered by the IHC: the John DiBiase Family Scholarship, the Amato Scholarship, and the IHC Scholarship. As in the past, the application will be available both on line and in the lobby. Two significant changes to the application have been agreed upon by the committee. The application will no longer request parental financial information though there will a section noting special financial circumstances, if any. The essay topic has also changed. This year's topic will be: please explain how an Italian person WHOM YOU KNOW has inspired you. This could be a relative, neighbor or community member.

Scholarship applications are only available to members (either regular or associate) of the IHC and their dependents. The applicant must be enrolled full time in an institution of higher learning. Unfortunately, prior winners are not eligible to apply. The scholarships are distributed directly to the student in two payments of \$750 each. More details in future issues of the newsletter.

REVISITING CHRISTMAS EVE

January 17, 2014, \$25 per person

Since January is usually our quiet month, the Cultural Committee thought it would be a good idea to introduce those members and their guests in a demonstration as to how to prepare a traditional “Seven Fish” dinner. Or as the Italians call it “La Vigilia di Natale”. This is the celebration of Christmas Eve and considered the most festive night of the year. While holiday meals are an integral part of our social culture, Christmas Eve is a special time for families to attend mass and then gather with family and friends to celebrate and reminisce about the past and share a delicious meal of seasonal foods.

I would like to give you history of the seven fish. There are three theories:

The seven sacraments of the Catholic Church – Baptism, penance, Holy Eucharist, confirmation, marriage, holy orders and the sacrament of the sick.

The seven sins of the world – pride, envy, anger, gluttony, sloth, lust and greed.

The seven days it took Mary and Joseph to travel to Bethlehem.

A typical Christmas Eve meal may include:

Baccala, cod fish balls, deep fried shrimp, fish, scallops, smelts, seafood salad, eel, octopus salad, lobster, calamari, oysters, and linguine with anchovy, clam, lobster, tuna or crab sauce.

I was asked to chair this event and I have asked other volunteers to help me prepare the following menu (You will be presented with recipes.)



Appetizer: Calamari salad, baccala salad, roasted peppers (roasted in the oven) and an assortment of olives and bread. Served family style.



Entree: Family style linguini fini with clams and anchovies and capers (white sauce) and linguini fini with baccala sauce with onions and savoy cabbage (red sauce).

The entrée will also include fried haddock, fried smelts, scallops and shrimp scampi. Broccoli rappi and savoy cabbage will be the vegetables.



Dessert: Assortment of homemade Italian cookies.

Two bottles of wine will be on each table.

We will have to limit this event to 125 people. So please call early. Hope to see you there. It should be quite an evening. Thank you! Marianne





