## Board Director Vacancy

### **Article X - Vacancies**

**Section 1.** In the event of a vacancy declared by the President resulting from the death, resignation or removal of a Primary Officer, Elected Director or Activities Director, the position shall be filled by a special election to be called by the President or, in the absence of the President, by the Vice President. This election shall be held at the next regular meeting following the notice of vacancy. All members shall be notified of the vacancy in writing at least seven (7) days before said meeting. A plurality vote shall be sufficient to fill the vacancy. Any Primary Officer, Elected Director or Activities Director who has been removed or has deemed to have resigned pursuant to these By-Laws is not eligible to be nominated or elected in the special election.

**As announced at the General Meeting of December 21, 2017, we have a vacancy on the Board of Directors. There will be a special election at the General Meeting on Thursday, January 18, 2018 for the purpose of electing a Board Director to serve for the remainder of the term, which ends June 30, 2018. Nominations will come from the floor and will be voted on that night. If you wish to be considered, but you are unable to come to the General Meeting, please notify the President in writing as soon as possible.**

## Nominating Committee For 2018 Elections

### **Article IX - Elections - Section 1**

All nominations for Primary Officers and Elected Directors shall be submitted at the first regular meeting in April. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) members: one appointed by the President, one appointed by the Chair of the Cultural Program Committee, one appointed by the Chair of the Activities Committee, and two elected by the membership. The Nominating Committee shall be established at least three (3) months prior to nomination night and shall submit a slate of Primary Officers and Elected Directors on nomination night. This slate of Primary Officers and Elected Directors can be added to on nomination night by a motion from the floor. All candidates who are nominated from the floor must be fully qualified to hold the position for which they have been nominated, and must either be present to accept the nomination, or submit written acceptance of the nomination to the President prior to the meeting. All members making nominations from the floor shall be subject to the same standards imposed upon the Nominating Committee for selection of nominees.

### **Article XII - Committees - Section 7 - Nominating Committee**

This committee shall stimulate interest among the members to seek leadership positions at the Center and shall identify those members who have an interest in, and an ability to contribute to, the advancement of the vision, mission and purpose of the Center. This committee shall also study and recommend policies to the Board of Directors for the nomination and election of Officers and Directors. It shall conduct interviews and make such other inquiries as are necessary to make informed nominations of interested and qualified people to leadership positions. This committee shall utilize its impartial, good faith best efforts to recruit only those individuals whose credentials and qualifications will serve and promote the best interests of the Center.

**We have various positions opening up as a result of terms ending in 2018. Therefore, we will be establishing a Nominating Committee that will be responsible to schedule interviews with nominees for each position which will take place during the months of February and March. The Nominating Committee will present their selections at the April General Meeting. Voting takes place in May and Installation will take place in June.**



The author of "Pinocchio" ("pine nut"), Carlo Collodi (1826-1890), was Italian.

Italians suffer more earthquakes than any other Europeans. In 1693, an estimated 100,000 people died in an earthquake in Sicily. The deadliest recent quake in Italy occurred in Naples in 1980, killing 3,000 people.
