Growing up, I was raised Italian. Every Sunday, our family would get together for dinner. My Nonna, Nonno, Uncle Jamee, cousin Rosie, Auntie Anna, Mom, Dad, and sister Emily would sit down at our long table and start passing the many dishes around in a clockwise motion. By the time the dessert and coffee rolled around, my stomach was already stuffed with pasta, sauce, sausage, salads, and side dishes, but I was always able to squeeze in some of my Nonno's pizzelles and my Auntie Anna's homemade desserts. For as long as I can remember this was my Sunday night, and my Nonna and Nonno made sure we always got together. I once went to my friend's house for her family's Sunday dinner. I was shocked, we ate Chinese food and there was no trace of the homemade dishes I was accompanied to. They also didn't have an abundance of food that could feed three times as many people sitting around the table like there always was when my mom and Nonna cooked at my house. Now being a little older, I am thankful for my Nonna showing me how to cook all our Italian dinners and desserts, some that I will cook for the rest of my life, and that there is never a shortage of food or good company at our house on Sunday nights.

In the summer of 2017, I was lucky enough to take a trip to Italy with the Italian Heritage club, my mom, my three cousins, and my nonna and nonno. We explored the town of Lettomanoppello, where my nonno's father was raised, and got to experience Italian culture all around us. My favorite memory from Italy was of my nonna and I. I got sick on the trip, so as the group was off taking a tour, my nonna stayed behind with me (which I still appreciate beyond words). We decided to take a long walk on the hunt for food. The entire trip nonna had been talking about how she had forgotten most of her Italian, but once we found a pizza parlour she started conversing with the man serving us like Italian was the only language she knew. This walk was my favorite because it felt connected to everyday life in Italy, not to mention how cool it was to hear my nonna speak beautifully in Italian. Once again my nonna inspired me, this time to speak Italian.

Next year I will be a freshman at the University of Rhode Island studying textiles, fashion design and Italian. By my junior year at Rhode Island, I will be moving to Milan — the textile capital of the world — to continue my study of textiles and design. I consider myself extremely lucky to have my career based in a culture that my nonno and nonna instilled in me. Although I'll be miles away from family Sunday dinners, the values that my nonno and nonna taught me will stay with me wherever I go.

I knew the millisecond I got this prompt that I was going to write about my Mom. Helen Scalia is one of my favorite people in the world. She's caring, kind, thoughtful, whip-smart, and an infinite amount of other superlative adjectives. For this essay though, I'm gonna focus on how she's impressed two of her core values on me: education and family. My mom is the definition of a financial wizard. She got her degree from NYU and has made sure I never forget the importance of learning. At home, this manifested in her always making sure I saved some of my birthday cash for my college fund even before I could comprehend what college was. She also brought these ideals out of the house and into my schooling. While I was in elementary school, she would come to my class and teach courses on financial literacy to me and my classmates. No profit, no benefit to her, all she wanted was to help the kids of Portland be a little smarter about their penny-pinching.

This selfless commitment to helping kids reach their full potential has inspired me to make teaching my vocation and pursue an education degree at the University of Maine at Farmington's honors program this fall. I look up to him for being such a strong individual after the amount he has been through not only as a child but as an adult as well.

One major life lesson that my grandfather has taught me is to never stop fighting. Since 2014, my Papa has had two heart attacks, almost losing his life both times. After emergency surgery and battling, he survived both and never stopped fighting. This is another reason why I look up to him. He has shown incredible amounts of strength and courage throughout life, even when he could have given up. He survived what some would have thought to be impossible. This has helped me tremendously, making me feel like I can do anything. Watching him recover from his second heart attack, I realized what a toll heart surgery takes on you. He was constantly tired, irritable, and pained. It was not easy for him to go through, but he did. He has come far since then, and I am proud of him, as proud as he is of me at my track meets, when I receive awards, or achieve something great. His strength and will to never give up has pushed me through the hardest and most stressful points in life, whether it is on the track or in the classroom trying to achieve my goals. I feel that he has prepared me for my future in nursing, which many say is an extremely difficult career. However, because of his lesson to never give, I know that I will be able to handle it.



For example, every year on Christmas Eve my mother and grandmother take out a recipe book, full of my great grandmother's recipes, and they make big batches of cookies to share with our whole family. These recipes are special because they are traditions my great grandmother passed down as part of her Italian legacy, and when my mother was younger, her grandmother, my great grandmother, would teach her how to bake using these recipes every Christmas Eve. Now, my grandmother and mother guide me and teach me how to carry out these traditions, and some day my mother will teach my kids, and I will teach my grandkids, so that these traditions stay alive.

Although I may not have known her, my great grandmother has made an immense impact on my life, as an Italian female. I hope someday, my great grandchildren can look back and feel the same way about me, because I don't want them to feel like they have lost touch with part of their identity, just because they live in America. I want to teach people that culture doesn't die just because you don't live where it is born, but instead it has followed them, and it has been all around them for many days and many years, and it will never leave.




