## **MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY**


Dear Members and Friends,

One could choose from a lengthy list of Italian-speaking racketeers who loom large in American culture, but it was Lucky Luciano who made the biggest imprint by establishing the template for modern organized crime in the States. Born Salvatore Lucania in Sicily in 1897, Luciano came of age in New York City's Lower East Side and put his talents to use for crime bosses Joe Masseria and Arnold Rothstein. After knocking off the previous generation's "Mustache Petes" who ran the Mafia, Luciano brought together the New York City, Chicago, and Buffalo syndicates under the umbrella of "The Commission" to ensure peace and prosperity between competing factions. The high times came crashing down when Luciano was convicted of prostitution charges in 1936, but he still possessed enough of a lucky touch to earn a commuted sentence for assisting the U.S. government during World War II.

## ITALIAN PRIDE REASON #24

### SHROUD OF TURIN


Catholics have always cherished physical items that are associated with saints or with Jesus Christ Himself. They call these items relics, and one of Christianity's most sacred and controversial is the Shroud of Turin. On this fragile yellowed cloth there is a life-sized image of a bearded man who appears to have wounds on his hands and feet, around his head, in his side, and on his back. Is this the actual imprint of Jesus? Many Christians believe it is, but the authenticity of the relic is hotly contested.

The actual history only goes as far back as 1203, when French crusader Robert de Clari describes seeing the shroud in Constantinople. Its first documented appearance, however, did not occur until 1353 in Liey, France, and since 1578 the shroud has been housed in the Duomo di San Giovanni in Turin and has remained there almost continuously ever since.

Displayed openly only a few times each century, the shroud is truly awe-inspiring. What is most remarkable is that the image appears to be a photographic negative of a human form. A recent carbon testing has placed its origin at around the year 1325, but the accuracy of those tests is open to debate. If it is a fraud, there is still no explanation as to how the image could have been created by medieval forgers who knew nothing about modern photographic techniques. All tests have failed to duplicate the imprint of the bleeding, wounded man that appears so realistically on this linen.

The shroud continues to be an object of fascination to the faithful and skeptical alike who want to peer at this mysterious imprint. It has become the single most examined relic in human history, and the public's reverence for it shows no sign of abating. At the last public display of the shroud in this century, in 1998, four thousand visitors an hour paid their respects.

Whether the actual image of Christ or a clever fabrication, this artifact makes an indelible impression on those lucky enough to view the real thing in person. And to do that, you have got to go to the wonderful Italian city of Turin.
